RULES

Any violation of the following rules can result in termination and/or loss of visit(s). Last session for visitors will begin at 10:30 PM. Lobby doors will be locked from the hours of 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM. The call box is available between these times for emergencies, bail and custody information.

1. All visitors must clear security measures (metal detector, etc.).
2. Inmates may have two 30 minute visits each week (week is from Monday through Sunday).
3. Visits will start on the half hour (no exceptions) visitor must be here at least 15 minutes before the half hour to sign up for visits.
4. Only one car key may be taken back during visiting (no key rings or car alarm remotes). The department will not be responsible for any lost, stolen or misplaced property not allowed in this facility. Security of property will be the visitor's responsibility. No property is to be left on the counters or be held by personnel (no exceptions)
5. No hats, purses, briefcases, etc. will be permitted into the facility
6. No gum, cigarettes, lighters, matches, tobacco, sunglasses, pagers, cellular phones, or excess jewelry.
7. Inmates may have both visits on the same day.
8. Visitors can visit as many inmates as they like (time permitting).
9. Mother and father, grandfather and grandmother may visit together. This will count as one visit only.
10. Visitors must be 18 years old (unless emancipated or married, proof needed).
11. All visitors must have a United States Government Photo ID or written permission from Correctional Lieutenant or Correctional Sergeant.
12. All visitors must meet required dress code. (See below)
13. No children under the age of 18 are allowed to sit in the lobby or vehicles without proper adult supervision. If children can not be controlled during visiting the visit will be terminated.
14. All visitors' attire must clear the metal detector. Any delays resulting from failure to do so will cause visit to be reassigned to the next half hour.

ATTIRE FOR VISITING

1. Visitors shall be dressed appropriately when they visit. Attire which is similar in appearance to inmate attire or excessively revealing shall not be permitted. If there is a question on the appropriateness of clothing, the final determination shall be made by the Corrections Sergeant/OIC.
2. The following items are unacceptable for visiting:
 - a. Tub tops, tank tops, sleeveless garments.
 - b. Bike shorts (spandex).
 - c. Swim suits.
 - d. Skimpy/short shorts and/or mini skirts.
 - e. See through clothing that by the nature of the fabric is revealing beyond the point where a reasonable person may be offended.
 - f. No hats, gloves or scarves.
 - g. No metal objects. You will be required to clear a metal detector. You will not be allowed to visit if you fail to clear the metal detector.
 - h. Any clothing with obscene or offensive designs or writing shall not be allowed.
3. Shoes or sandals must be worn and must clear the metal detector.

FAMILY VISITS

A-1 (CLASS)	First Monday of each month
A-2 (CLASS)	First Monday of each month
A-2 (ADSEG)	Second Monday of each month
A-1 (ADSEG)	Second Monday of each month
A-2 (GREEN)	Third Monday of each month
B-2 (ADSEG and PC)	Second Monday of each month
B-1 (CLASS)	Third Monday of each month
B-2 and C-2 (CLASS)	Fourth Monday of each month
B1 and A-2 (PC)	Fourth Monday of each month

The purpose of family visits is to allow children, younger siblings and grandchildren under the age of 18 to visit with their parent/guardian or grandparent.

1. Inmates may request a family visit by filling out an appointment sheet.
2. Approved family visits must be listed in the Records Section before visits are allowed.
3. Family visits count towards the minimum visits for the week. No more than two children may visit at a time. They must be accompanied by an adult. If inmate has more than two children, and the inmate has visiting time available, an additional appointment must be scheduled.
4. Visits are for 30 minutes.
