Re: Wanted parolee arrested after vehicle pursuit

On Wednesday October 24, 2007 at about 1200 hours, a Yolo County Deputy on patrol saw John Jones, 30 and his wife Kathleen Jones 27, both of Woodland, driving near the Woodland Watts airport. The deputy attempted to pull the vehicle over, as John Jones was wanted for a parole violation, and was listed as "armed and dangerous." Jones, along with his wife, failed to stop and attempted to evade the deputy. The suspect sped away and there began a high speed pursuit which ended when the suspect's vehicle crashed in the gravel pits near Cache Creek. After running into a ditch, the two suspects fled on foot.

A perimeter was set up, and an extensive search was conducted by Sheriff's Deputies, two CHP air units, and CHP and Woodland Police K-9 units. They were unable to locate the suspects.

Detectives from the Sheriff's Investigations Section began investigating the incident attempting to locate the suspects. On Tuesday, October 30, 2007, at approximately 1227 hours after an extensive investigation, Detectives located and arrested the suspect, John Jones along with Barrett Shockey 25, of Sacramento. They were located near the intersection of Lincoln and Walnut streets in Woodland. John Jones was arrested for being a parolee at large and for felony evading arrest. Barrett Shockey was arrested for parole violation. Additional charges are still pending.

Also on Tuesday, at approximately 1300 hours Kathleen Jones was located and arrested by investigators near Elm and Main streets in Woodland. She was arrested for resisting, delaying, and obstructing a peace officer. Other charges are still pending. The case is still under investigation.

Sheriff Prieto said, "I'm very proud of our investigators. They did an outstanding job in apprehending these suspects. Our investigators truly provide 'Service Without Limitations'."
