| Re: | Search in 3rd Day For Missing 'At Risk' Adult |

Yolo County Sheriff's Department has increased resources in a third day of search for a missing 'at risk' woman last seen on Wednesday, leaving the Cache Creek Casino.

Chee Tse left her home in San Francisco on Tuesday, July 1st at eight in the morning for a trip to the casino in Brooks. She was last seen Wednesday at five in the evening, walking eastbound on Highway 16 heading away from the casino.

She is described as an Asian woman, age 77, 5 feet 2 inches tall, 110 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. She was last known to be wearing a red shirt and black pants. Tse speaks only Cantonese and family has advised she has had aging mental health issues.

The Sheriff's Department was notified that Chee Tse was missing at approximately five-thirty Friday night. At that time Sheriff Deputies, along with the Rumsey and Guinda Fire Departments, began a thorough search of the area.

On Saturday morning resources were increased to include a wide spread of agencies and volunteers using ground and air search, mounted posse, search and tracking dogs, in a major attempt to locate the missing 'at risk' woman.

Today there is planned to be over fifty people involved in the massive search for the missing woman, which includes the Yolo County Sheriff's Department on duty and volunteer personnel, Office of Emergency Services, California Highway Patrol, Coastguard Auxiliary, Rumsey Rancheria and Guinda Fire Departments, along with assistance from other agencies in the Sacramento region and as far away as Contra Costa.

The area currently being searched is from the Colusa County line to the town of Esparto. The main concentration is in the Capay Valley area of Brooks.

Sheriff Ed Prieto requests, "If anyone has seen Chee Tse or has any information regarding her whereabouts, we urge you to contact the Yolo County Sheriff's Department or your local law enforcement agency."
